## **Old missals - Last chance to donate**

Hugh Lobo is planning to pick-up all our old missals on Wednesday the 30<sup>th</sup> in the morning, so it's a last call for anyone wanting to donate their old missal to churches in Africa.

Dear All,

At the end of June, MPs voted to decriminalise abortion up to the moment of birth and to legalise assisted suicide. These have not yet been enshrined in Law until they are considered by the House of Lords and returned to the House of Commons for final acceptance. So, we have time to continue opposing them as contrary not only to our understanding of God's Law, but also our respect for human life from the moment of conception to natural death. In fact, it is quite possible that the House of Lords will radically amend the deeply flawed Assisted Suicide Bill, if not actually vote against it, according to some commentators.

SPUC (The Society for the Protection of Unborn Children) requests your support for this ongoing defence of and respect for human life.

The Society requests that all parishes across our country engage in this effort, raising awareness at Masses over the weekend of 19<sup>th</sup>/ 20th July. There will be postcards at the back of our churches during the next two weeks, which you can post independently, or deliver to the presbytery for me to post in a prepaid envelope provided by the organisation. I shall also be speaking on this issue at our Sunday Masses at Tadley and Burghfield Common. Don't forget, there is no Saturday evening Mass this weekend, as highlighted in last week's Newsletter.

## **St. Francis Leprosy Guild Anniversary**

The Guild is the UK's only Catholic leprosy charity and celebrates its 130<sup>th</sup> Anniversary this year. It has asked for the following to be included in our Newsletter:

Reminder of Route 2: Park before 2:30 at Silchester recreation ground. This is a circular walk with some slopes up and down through Pamber Forest down to the stream and back up to Pamber Heath, then across the common to Silchester Methodist Church (1.8 miles). Then after tea the group will have a short walk to their car park at Silchester recreation ground (0.5 miles) - a total of 2.3 miles at a moderate pace.

### **THIS SUNDAY! Anna Chaplaincy Licensing Service – 20 July:**

Anna Chaplaincy is an ecumenical, community based, chaplaincy promoting the spiritual welfare of older people. It is a person centred and non-judgmental ministry for people of strong, little or no faith, visiting older people wherever they may be living.

Training has been undertaken by nine would-be Anna Chaplains and friends from across the Anglican Benefice and CTAT, who are in the process of discernment as to whether they should become Anna Chaplains, with a commitment of a day per week, or the lighter role of an Anna Friend. There will be a short

licensing and celebration service on Sunday 20th July at 4:00 PM, at Saint Pauls Church, Tadley, which the founder, Debbie Thrower, will be attending to licence the Tadley and Basingstoke participants. All welcome. Anna Chaplaincy is intended to support rather than replicate or replace ministry already being undertaken by churches. There will be a mapping project over the summer to identify what spiritual support to people in older age is already available and what needs could be met by Anna Chaplains & Friends in the future.
