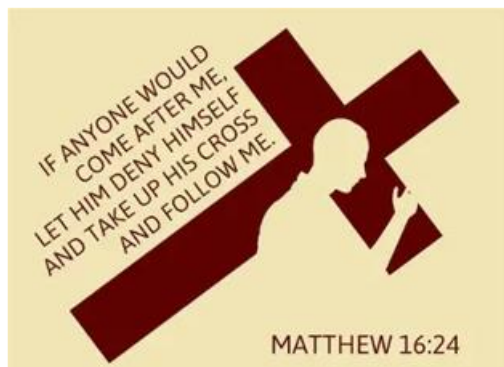

The Way of the Cross



Last Sunday, Peter made a profound profession of faith: “You are the Christ, the Son of the living God.” Jesus affirmed Peter’s faith and declared him to be the rock upon which He would build His Church. Yet, in this Sunday’s Gospel, we see how much Peter and the other Apostles still had to learn about what it truly meant for Jesus to be the Messiah.

Jesus tells them that He must go to Jerusalem, where He will suffer and be put to death, but that He will rise again. Peter cannot accept this. He expects the Messiah to come in glory and victory, not through suffering and the Cross.

Jesus then makes clear that the Cross is not only His path, but also the path of every true disciple: **“If anyone wants to be a follower of mine, let him renounce himself and take up his cross and follow me.”** To take up our cross does not mean seeking suffering for its own sake. It means accepting faithfully whatever sacrifices, difficulties and trials may come our way as we strive to live according to God’s will. It means putting God before self, resisting the seductions of the world, and trusting Him even when the path is difficult. The Cross may appear to be defeat, but in Christ it becomes the way to victory; suffering becomes the path to glory, and death becomes the gateway to Resurrection.

As Christians, we cannot truly follow Christ without following Him to the Cross. **The way of the Cross is the way to life.**
