Jubilee Year Hope?

The Tablet Catholic weekly reported last weekend that in 2023 Mass attendance on Sundays appear to increase by roughly 50,000 in England and Wales. In 2022 the figure was 503, 308; in 2023 it was 554, 913. However, it is not clear why there is an increase.

Nevertheless, the increase falls short of the numbers pre-Covid. In 2019, according to the Bishops of England and Wales, 701, 902 attended on a Sunday.

Stephen Bullivant, Professor of Theology and Sociology of Religion at Saint Mary's University, Twickenham, suspects that the extra 50,000 is an influx of new people, bigger for the first time than the numbers leaving after Covid. There is a similar development in Scotland, with 95,029 attending Sunday Mass in 2023, compared to 89,420 in 2022. But again, this is well below the 2019 figure of 127,003.

Whatever the cause of the increase in England and Wales and Scotland, it appears to be good news. Let us pray that it continues.

We are in a Jubilee Year, centred on Hope, one of the aims of which is to address the continuing outcomes and effects of Covid across our world. Christian hope is rooted in our relationship with Christ, whom we need to be with regularly on Sunday, The Day of Resurrection. Bishop David Oakley, Chair of our Bishop's Conference of England and Wales, rightly reminds us that, sadly:

“We live in an age that has almost lost touch altogether with the supernatural.... We even see signs of this within our communities of faith. We might pray for a deepening of the theological virtue of hope.... The Scriptures constantly focus our hearts and minds on the need to deepen hope.... Within a society radically anchored to life within the present moment, it is difficult for us to imagine what life will be like in the future. We often find ourselves trapped within the anxieties of what may have happened in our past and fear of what is to come.... An encounter with the healing love of the Lord enables us to imagine something different. And this is what hope is about”.

So let us pray that those returning to church on a Sunday, or experiencing a celebration of The Resurrection Day for the first time, will find a joyous welcome in our Christian Communities.

At the present moment, Churches Together Around Tadley (CTAT) are praying for our local town and the surrounding villages. Praying that God's blessings come down upon those who are finding life difficult because of length of years or sickness, those struggling with various addictions, those youngsters who may be in broken marriages or suffering domestic abuse. There are so many areas of all of our lives needing a sense of God-given Hope, of His Peace and Love and, importantly, His Joy filling our wounded humanity. Why not make this part of your Jubilee Prayer as well?
